## Procedure for Requesting Assistance

Requests for assistance will be accepted from RC&D sponsors, communities, non-profit organizations, coalitions of landowners or landowner associations.

Requests for assistance should relate to the RC&D purpose and must address one or more goals of the Council's Area Plan in the following categories:

- Land Conservation
- Water Management
- Community Development
- Land Management

Requests for assistance will be reviewed by the RC&D Council Director in the applicant's county prior to action by the entire Council.

When evaluating requests for assistance, the Board of Directors will consider the following:

- The project's contribution toward meeting established goals in the Area Plan.
- The project sponsor's ability to provide local support for the project.
- The capacity of the RC&D Council to provide assistance to the project.
- The RC&D sponsorship of the project applicant.
- The project's benefits versus the time and resources requested by the Council.

Requests for assistance can be directed to:

- The RC&D Director in your county.
- The Natural Resource Conservation Service office in your county.
- Any sponsoring organization of the RC&D Council.
- The High Plains RC&D Office

The request for assistance will be presented to the Board of Directors for approval by the county RC&D Director or local sponsor at a regular Board of Director's Meeting. Upon request from the Board of Directors you may be asked to present your request for assistance in person at a Board of Director's Meeting.
